Failsworth Community Fridge is a place where anyone can go and get free food/hygiene products if they are struggling to afford the basics. It is similar to a foodbank, however the community fridge does not require any token or voucher or proof of income to use it.

The fridge is based at Co-op Academy Failsworth and they rely on donations from school staff and students, as well as external donations from the public and businesses. Anyone can donate and anyone can use the Community Fridge.

This year, to support our community, all of our Harvest donations were sent to the Community Fridge, ensuring that the donations made by families and members of our school community remain in the local area. We'd like to say great big thank-you to everyone who was able to make a harvest donation this year.

Where debts occur, then unfortunately, we will be forced to withdraw your child's participation in clubs, and you will need to provide a packed lunch instead of them taking a school dinner.

Free School meals – are you eligible?

Oldham Council is urging families to check whether they are eligible for free school meals. You don't need to make a separate claim for free school meals if you are already in receipt of or have applied for Housing Benefit or help with Council Tax.

Oldham Council will use the information and evidence we have already provided to confirm your entitlement to free school meals.

Please remember that you need to apply for each child at school. Even if your children receive a universal free meal in Reception or KS1 you should still apply for them, as there are other benefits for them at school including free school uniform.
