

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### ParentPay - Please pay in advance

As we are at the end of the school year, we kindly ask that you check your child's ParentPay balances and bring any outstanding payments up to date. If your child is in Nursery or Years 3 to 6 and will be taking a school meal when we return in September please ensure that payments are made in advance.

Paying ahead helps the school manage costs and ensures services can continue smoothly for all children.

For your convenience, below are the upcoming payment amounts and deadlines:

#### Dinner Money:

Weekly Payments: £8.10 by Wednesday 3rd September

£13.50 by Sunday 8th September and so on.

Monthly Payment: £48.60 for September

£54.00 for October

Half Term: £102.60

#### Breakfast Club: (attending every day)

Weekly Payments: £3.00 by Wednesday 3rd September

£5 by Sunday 8th September and so on.

Monthly Payment: £18.00 for September

£20.00 for October

Half Term: £102.60



Where arrears do occur, the following steps will be taken as a reminder but also to support in minimising arrears:

- 1 week's arrears: A reminder via Class Dojo or a telephone call.
- 2 week's arrears: We will ask that any outstanding balance is settled and, in the meantime, request that your child brings a packed lunch and/or avoids attending breakfast club until the arrears are cleared.

We appreciate your continued support in keeping accounts up to date and helping us to provide the best service for all children.



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### Information for Parents in our current Nursery, Reception and Years 1 and 2

All children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 in state funded schools automatically receive free school meals. Regardless of family income through the Universal School Meals Scheme (UFSM).

### Parents of children moving into Reception in September

Your child can enjoy a school meal under the UFSM scheme - more information is in the information pack you received at the Reception Open Evening.

### Parents of children moving to Year 1 and 2 in September

Your child remains eligible to enjoy a free school meal under the UFSM scheme. If your child is currently on packed lunches and would like to move onto school meals from September, please let the office know.

### Parents of children Year 3 and Upwards

Unless your child is eligible for free school meals. The charge for a school meal is £2.70 per day or £13.50 per week. This is payable weekly via ParentPay.

Families in receipt of qualifying benefits can also apply for free school meals. Where your application is successful you will also be able to access other services, for example the Holiday Activities and Food programme which is a pro-gramme providing activities during the school holidays, funded by the Department of Education.

This would also mean that school would receive extra funding to fund learning resources. For more information go to the [Oldham.gov.uk](http://Oldham.gov.uk) website.




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### Free School Meals

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit - if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
